→ Explain what you learnt during the visit with Gaëlle.

We arrived at the Gonnegirls farm by 10.00 a.m.



We learnt that Gaëlle and Claire turn the soil differently to preserve carbon dioxide to make a seedling.

They don't use a tiller. We learnt what regenerative agriculture is. It is a production method that uses cultural and breeding practices in respect of natural balances without chemicals etc.

We learnt that young hens lay eggs from the age of 20 weeks and often until the age of 3 years old. Their metabolism then slows down and the hens begin to produce fewer eggs. They usually completely stop laying eggs around the age of 8 years old.





We learnt that the hens make the soil better and it's good because the grass can grow better. Gaëlle and Claire often move the hen houses.
